# **Preparing for Promotion**

The path to promotion begins with **high-quality**, **grade-level instruction in** preschool, kindergarten, and beyond.

Students in need of more targeted support also receive intervention in the form of **tutoring** and **RTI**<sup>2</sup>, or response-to-intervention.

## Third Grade **APPEALS**

With parent consent, KCS can apply for an appeal on behalf of a student. Parents of students eligible for an appeal will receive a request for consent through ParentSquare<sup>1</sup>. <sup>1</sup> Paper forms will also be available.

### The state recognizes **TWO** reasons for appeal:



- Student<sup>2</sup> scored approaching on ELA TCAP
- **AND** scored **at or above the 40th percentile** on the Spring Universal Reading Screener



Student experienced a "catastrophic event" within 60 days of the TCAP test

<sup>2</sup> Students granted an appeal must participate in year-long tutoring in 4th grade.

### Fourth Grade: Pathways to **FIFTH GRADE**

Score

### Meet student- specific

Meets or Exceeds Expectations



Commit to year-long tutoring in 5th grade

at the recommendation of student's principal, 4th grade ELA teacher, and parent in a **parent conference\*** 

on the ELA portion of 4th grade TCAP \*determined using a formula established by TDOE and shared with families

**TDOE Adequate Growth FAQ** 

*\*individual plan of support for the student will be created by conference participants* 

# **PROMOTION to FIFTH GRADE**

## Understanding **EXEMPTIONS**

Students who score approaching or below will **NOT** be retained if any of the following are true: Common Misconception: 504s are NOT automatic exemptions

- → Student has a disability that impacts reading
- Student is an English learner and has received fewer than 2 years of English instruction
- → Student has been retained previously

Student has a suspected disability that impacts literacy development

### Retention & Promotion Communication **TIMELINE**

**ASAP** – Communication of change in state law and new 4th grade promotion pathways (as soon as bill is signed into law)

#### Week of May 20 – Communication of TCAP scores to 3rd grade families

• Will include consent to retest for eligible students

**Week of May 20** – Communication to 4th grade families stating whether students have reached their adequate growth target or scored proficient on the TCAP

• Will include information regarding parent conferences for qualifying students

#### May 24 – Communication of retest scores to 3rd grade families

• Will include opportunity to participate in Summer Learning Camp and/or tutoring for qualifying students
